We now provide access to PsychiatryOnline, a web-based resource that features DSM-IV-TR® and electronic psychiatry journals and textbooks from American Psychiatric Publishing, Inc. The DSM® Library titles include DSM-IV-TR®, DSM-IV-TR® Handbook of Differential Diagnosis, and DSM-IV-TR® Casebook and its Treatment Companion. Journals include The American Journal of Psychiatry, Psychiatric Services, Journal of Neuropsychiatry and Clinical Neurosciences, Psychosomatics, and Academic Psychiatry.

[In the First Person: Index to Letters, Diaries, Oral Histories and Other Personal Narratives](#)

Working with archives, repositories, publishers, and individuals they have indexed first person narratives from hundreds of published volumes—those that are publicly available on the Web and those that are held by repositories and archives around the world. The intent is to make it possible to find and explore the voices of more than 300,000 individuals. The index covers both free and commercial subscription sites.

An archive of social memory that brings together the voices of ordinary men and women from all walks of life with the personal accounts of well-known historical figures.

[Scopus](#)

Scopus is an abstract and citation database of peer-reviewed literature and quality Web sources with smart tools to track analyze and visualize research. It contains abstracts and references from over 15,000 peer-reviewed journals from 4,000 publisher's worldwide, ensuring broad interdisciplinary coverage. A link to the full-text of the article is often included.

Subject areas covered:

Life Sciences >3,400 titles

Health Sciences > 5,300 titles (including 100% coverage of Medline titles)

Physical Sciences > 5,500 titles

Social Sciences > 2,850 titles
