### **New Edition of the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association**

A new [6th edition](#) was published this summer. The Library has many reference copies plus 3 copies in the Regenstein Bookstacks for check out. Unfortunately the APA has not released an online version. They do have an [APA Style blog](#) and an [APA Style web page](#) with supplemental materials and related resources available online.

There are errors in the first printing. If you bought your own copy the APA has released a [corrections document](#).

### **Citation Alerts and Journal Analyzing with Scopus and Web of Science**

Scopus and Web of Science allow you to track how often articles (for example from a particular author or journal) have been cited and then notify you by e-mail when new documents that cite a specific document or author are loaded into the database.

Scopus also allows you to compare up to ten journals by a variety of parameters, including the following:

- Total number of citations
- Articles published
- Percentage of articles not cited
- Trend line

"Journal Citation Reports" via Web of Science allows you to compare journals by title, subject, publisher, or country and provides data on the following:

- Total number of citations
- Impact factor
- 5-year impact factor
- Immediacy index
- Cited half-life
- Eigenfactor score
- Article influence score
