

Eckhart Hall

**T**he Eckhart Library is located on the second floor of Eckhart Hall and contains over 55,000 volumes in mathematics, statistics, and computer science. Books and bound journal volumes are shelved by the Library of Congress classification system. Unbound journal issues are shelved by title. Reserve materials for mathematics, statistics, and computer science courses are maintained in Eckhart Library. Most titles can be located by searching the Library Catalog, which is available from the Library's web site: [www.lib.uchicago.edu/e/eck](http://www.lib.uchicago.edu/e/eck).

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### Electronic Resources

Electronic journals can be located online by searching the Library Catalog or using the "E-Journals" link on the Library's web site. Databases can be located using the Database Finder. For more information, see "Electronic Resources" on page 4.

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### The Collections

The mathematics collection contains research level materials in all areas of pure mathematics with particular emphasis on analysis, algebra, number theory, logic, and topology. This collection also includes materials in selected areas of applied mathematics, including fluid dynamics, control theory, and optimization.

The statistics collection provides research level monographs and journals in probability and statistics for advanced users. More general books are also available for users with less complex statistical needs. Collection strengths include probability theory, statistical data analysis, and stochastic processes.

The computer science collection focuses on theoretical computer science, including mathematical aspects of computing, computational complexity, algorithms, logic, and the use of computers to solve mathematical and scientific problems.

## Circulation

A current validated Chicago ID Card is required to borrow materials. Loan periods depend on type of material:

- ∞ **Books and conference proceedings:** regular loan (quarter or indefinite).
- ∞ **Bound journals:** 7 days – not renewable.
- ∞ **Unbound journal issues:** 2 hours.
- ∞ **Reserves:** 2 hours, 24 hours, 48 hours, or 7 days – not renewable.

All materials, except reserve items, should be returned in the inside Circulation Desk drop box during library hours. Reserve items should always be returned directly to staff. After hours, all materials can be returned using the two exterior drop boxes; one is located immediately

outside the entrance to the Library, and the other is located outside the building in the archway between Eckhart and Ryerson Halls.

## Course Materials / Reserves

The print reserve collection includes course materials for mathematics, statistics, and computer science classes and the core graduate mathematics books. Reserve materials circulate for 2 hours, 24 hours, 48 hours, or 7 days. Reserve materials are housed behind the Circulation Desk; a call number is required to request a title. Some course materials are available in electronic form. To locate materials for your course, you will need to log into Chalk (chalk.uchicago.edu), the University's course management system, using your CNetID. Once you are logged in, you will see a listing of classes for which you are enrolled. Your course readings are linked from each individual course site.

## Borrowing Privileges

Borrowing privileges vary based on University status and affiliation. If you have questions about privileges, consult the ID & Privileges Office in Regenstein Library.

## Renewals

Library materials may be renewed using the "My Account" feature in the Library Catalog, in person at the Circulation Desk, or via e-mail or US mail. Any renewable item may be renewed three times before the item must be physically brought back to the library. At that time the item may be returned or checked out again. Reserve items, recalled items, and 7-day loan items may not be renewed.

## Recalls

Items that are checked out may be recalled from the current user by clicking on the "Recall Item" button in the Library Catalog. Recalls usually take from 7 to 10 days. When the item is returned, you will be notified and it will be held for you at the library you selected.

## Search Requests

If you can't find a book or other item on the shelf, you can fill out a search request by clicking on the "Can't Find It?" link in the Lens Search or Library Catalog record for that item. Library staff will search for the missing item and contact you via email with the results of the search. If located, we will hold the item for you at the Circulation Desk.

### Computers

Eckhart Library has five public computers for accessing the Library Catalog and other electronic resources. Priority is given to library users accessing research and instruction related resources.

### Database Finder

Select the Database Finder on the Library's web site to locate full-text resources, indexes, and other electronic resources available through the University of Chicago Library. The Database Finder allows you to locate resources by name, subject, or type of materials. You can customize your own list of electronic resources by using the "My Space" feature.

### Find It!

*Find It!* helps you locate the article or book directly from a citation in one of the Library's electronic resources. Click on the  icon in the database record to locate the article or book you need for your research. If full-text of an article is available online, *Find It!* will direct you to correct electronic resources that provide access the item. If an online version is not available, you can use *Find It!* to search the Library Catalog for a print copy. If the item is

unavailable from the Library, you can use *Find It!* to place an interlibrary loan request. *Find It!* links are also available in Google Scholar.

### RefWorks and EndNote

RefWorks and EndNote are tools that allow you to import citations directly from catalogs and other online resources into your own personal database. These tools help you organize and manage your research as well as create bibliographies and footnotes automatically using MS Word. The Library supports EndNote and RefWorks through classes and reference services. Current students, faculty and staff have access to RefWorks through the Library's web site.

### Off Campus Access

Current University of Chicago students, faculty, and staff may connect to the majority of the Library's electronic resources from anywhere around the world. Links to electronic resources on the Library's web site have been configured to use the proxy server. When accessing Library resources from off-campus, you will be automatically prompted to log-in using your CNetID.
