

## Library Student Resource Group

The purpose of the Library Student Resource Group (LSRG) is to

- open a formal channel of communication between students and the Library Administration. This includes communication about all the University libraries – Crerar, D'Angelo Law, Eckhart, Harper, Regenstein, SSAd and Yerkes.
- provide a forum to represent student views on a variety of issues of importance to the Library. This includes feedback about collections, access, services, and present and future needs of the student community.
- assist in planning for future change by considering proposals for changes in services.
- make specific recommendations that would improve the Library.
- discuss how the Library can most effectively communicate its resources, services and plans with students, and conversely, how students can most effectively communicate their wishes, needs and concerns to the Library.

The Council is made up of

- 3 students from the College
- 4 students, one from each of the Divisions (Biological Sciences Division, Humanities Division, Physical Sciences Division, and Social Sciences Division)
- 3 students from the Professional Schools (Divinity, GSB, Harris, Law, Pritzker, SSA)
- The Library's Assistant Director for Access & Facilities – Jim Vaughn
- The Library's Assistant Director for Humanities & Social Sciences – Sem Sutter
- The Assistant to The Director of the University Library – John Kimbrough
- The Director of the University Library, who will chair the group – Judith Nadler

Deans of Students, working with Anne Saporito in the Office of the Vice-President and Dean of Students in the University, will identify individuals from each unit to fill the student slot(s). These names will then be forwarded to Student Government's Executive Slate. Appointments will be made at the beginning of the academic year and are for a two-year term, which is non-renewable.

The Council will meet approximately 2 times per quarter, with the year's dates selected at the first meeting.

The Library's goal is that the LSRG engage students in the life of the Library and provide the Library with a structure for the meaningful exchange of ideas with the constituency that is at the heart of the Library's service.
