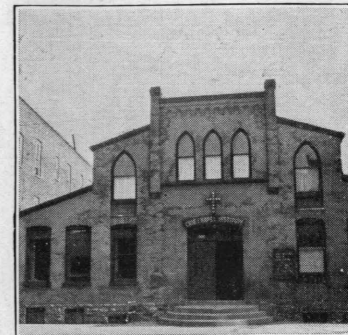

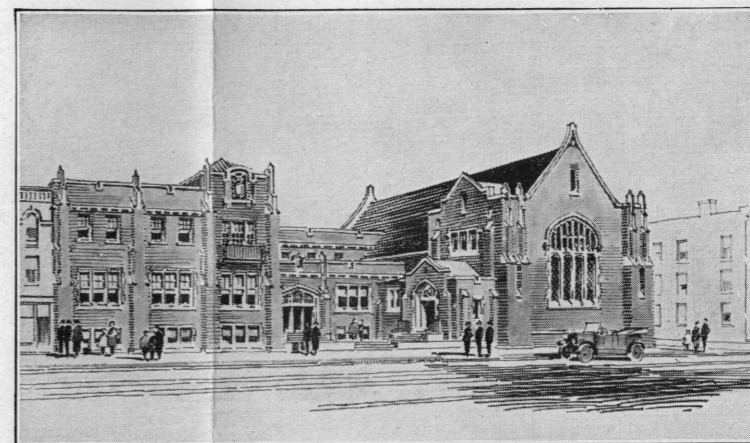

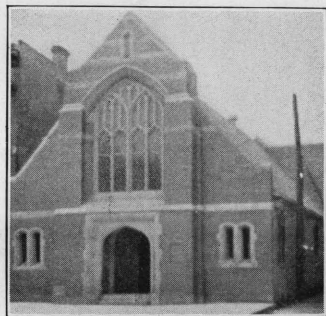

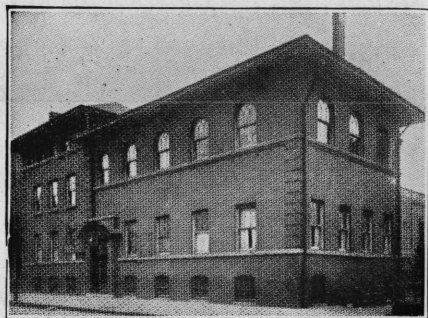

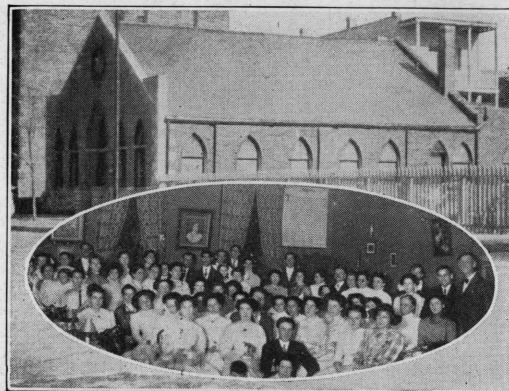

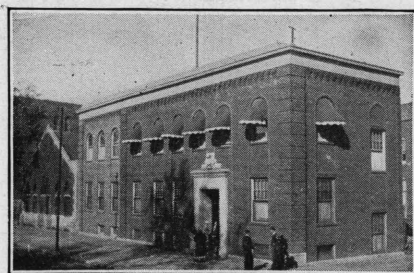

2. The Home Mission Committee

"At a meeting of the Synod of Peoria held in Chicago, June 1847, it was voted to erect a new Presbytery, to be called the Presbytery of Chicago; also resolved that a Committee of three ministers be appointed, through whom the churches under our care may make their application for aid to the American Home Missionary Society. F. Bascom, R. W. Patterson and A. W. Henderson were appointed said committee."

3. The Presbyterian League

"Chicago, April 29, 1873, 3 P. M., the officers and members of the Presbyterian League of Chicago met by call of its Executive Committee. Rev. Messrs. Trowbridge and Davis were appointed a committee, as far as they were able to find material therefor, to restore the records of the League, destroyed in the great fire of October 9, 1871.

"The Presbyterian League of Chicago received its special charter from the General Assembly of Illinois. Its object is to promote the advancement of Evangelical Christianity by helping the poorer neighborhoods, of Chicago and suburbs, to plant and foster Presbyterian Church and Mission Buildings."

4. The Church Extension Board

Minutes Chicago Presbytery, April 8, 1907

"Rev. W. P. Merrill, chairman, presented the report of the special committee on unification of Presbytery's work, which was approved. The committee nominates as the standing committee on Church Extension, Ministers: W. H. W. Boyle, W. C. Covert, E. H. Curtis, G. N. Luccock, W. P. Merrill, W. R. Notman, John Balcom Shaw; Elders: J. W. Janney, T. E. D. Bradley, T. A. Hall, E. A. Halsey, C. S. Holt, T. G. McCulloh, Corydon A. Reed, Frank S. Shaw."

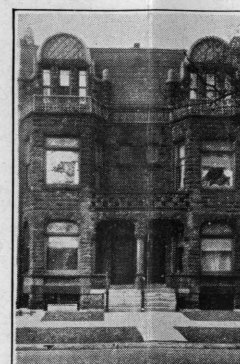

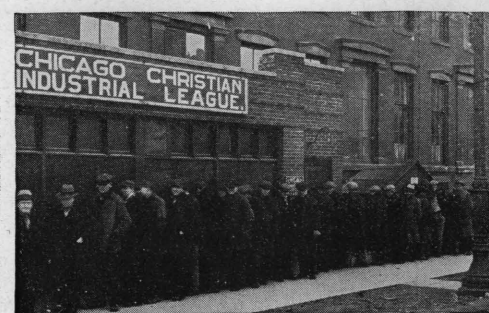

JESUS FACING THE CITY THROUGH THE PRESBYTERY

“The Church Extension Board shall have supervision of the field of the Presbytery, with reference to the work of evangelization, Christian Social Work, the planting and fostering of Presbyterian Churches, Sabbath Schools and Missions, the location and erection of church buildings, and the securing funds for the work under its care.

“It shall have power to advise the union of churches, their removal to other locations, or

the sale of their property. All applications for the organization of new churches shall come to the Presbytery through this Board.

“No church or congregation of this Presbytery shall procure or change a site for a house of worship or make any contract for the erection of a church building or enlargement of the site or building, without the approval of the Church Extension Board.”
