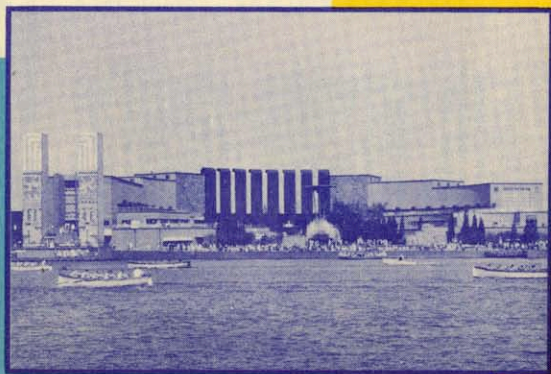

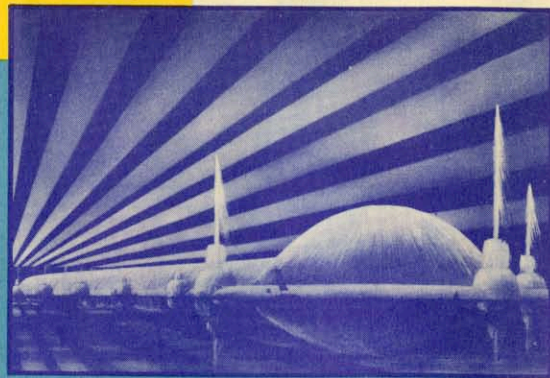

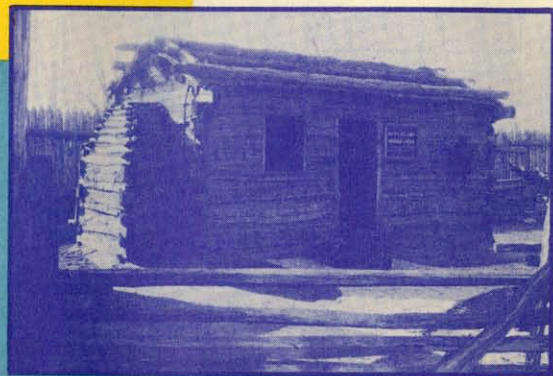
Enchanted Island—
North Entrance Portal



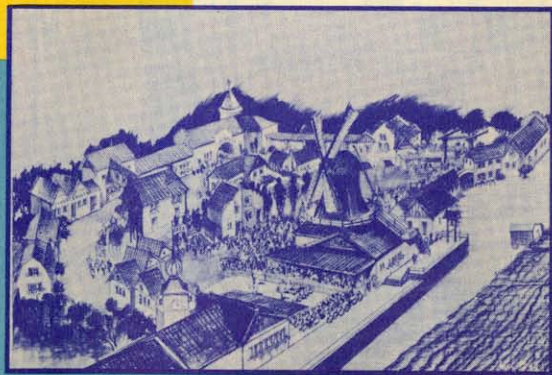

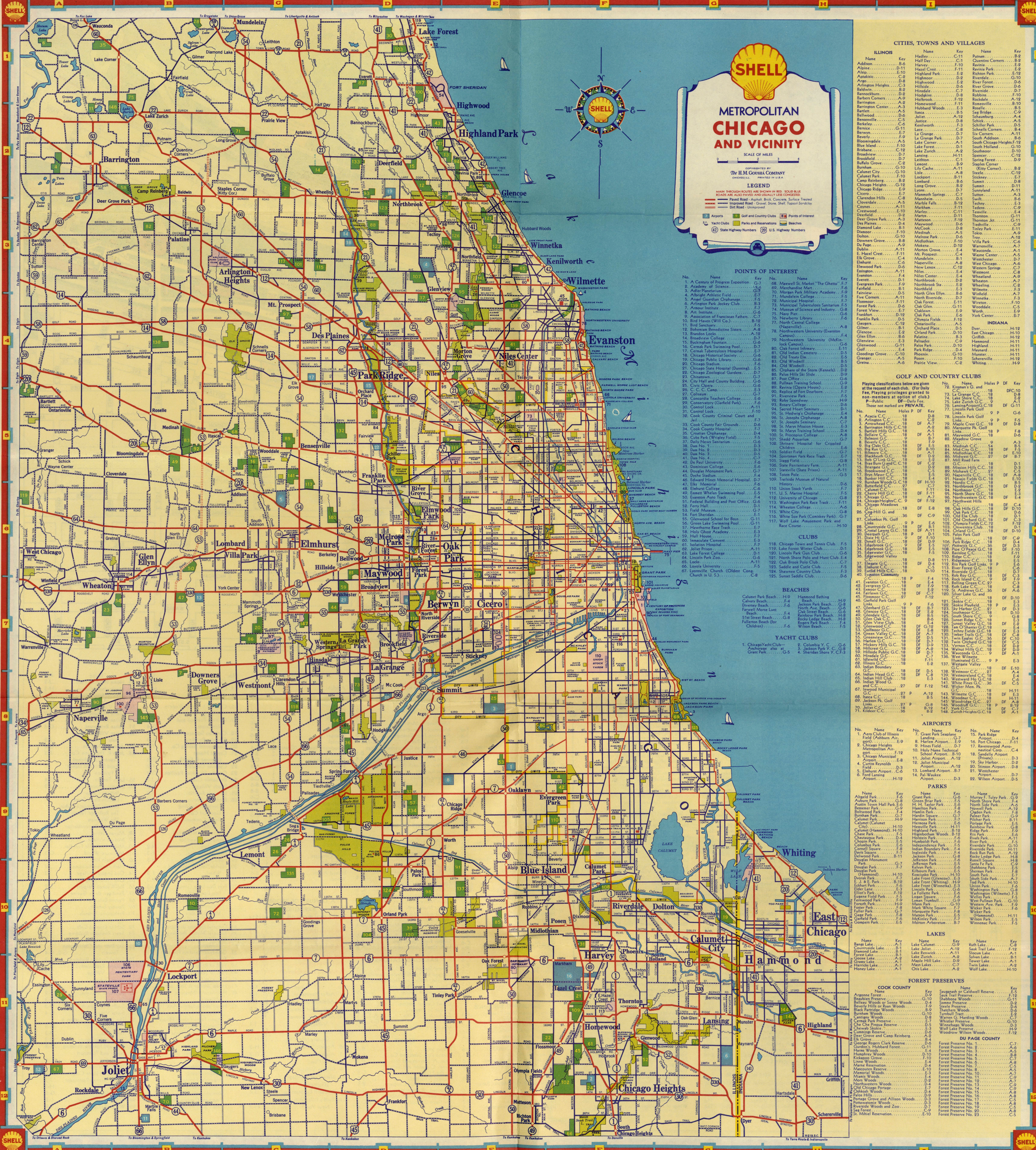

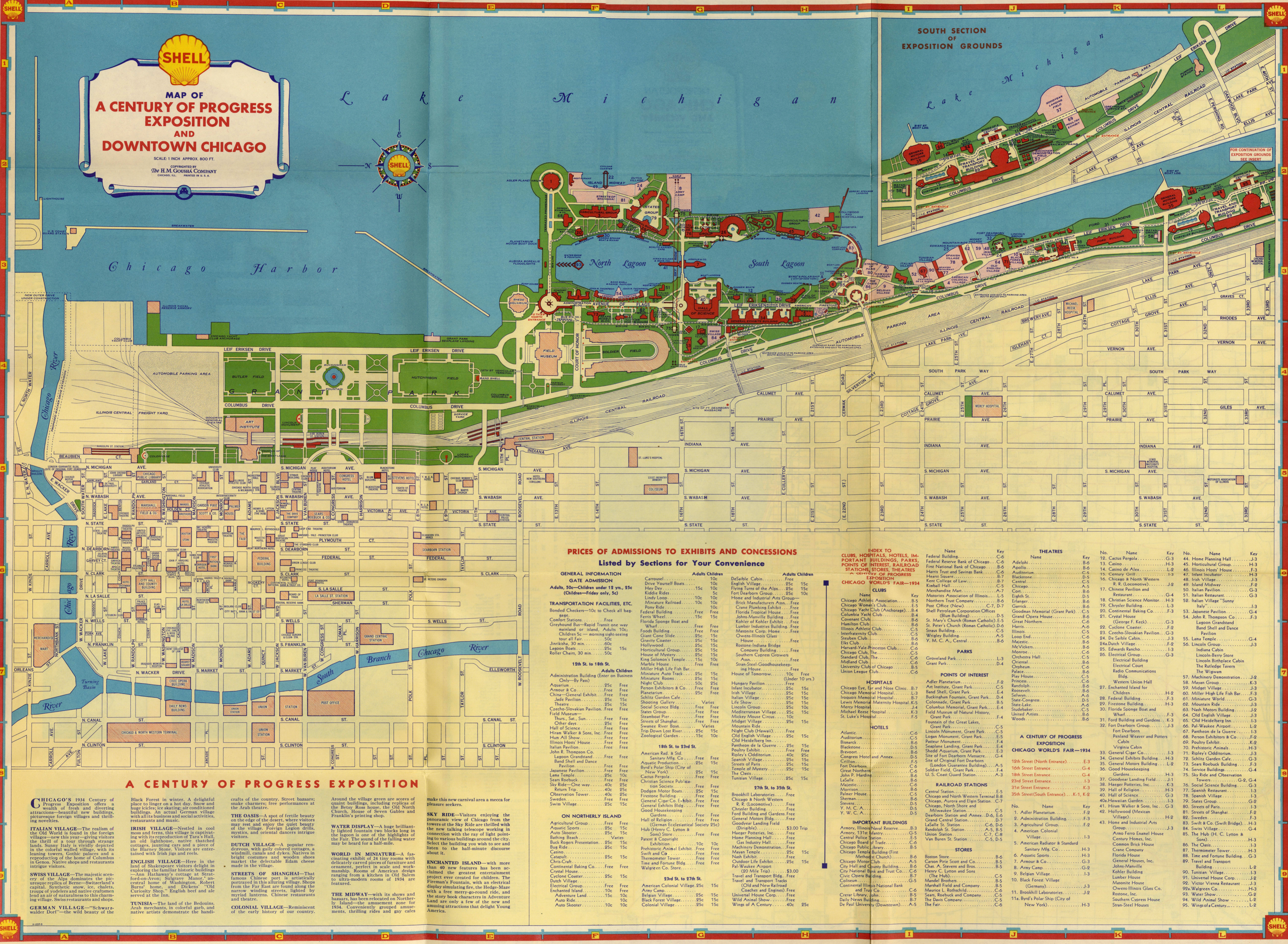
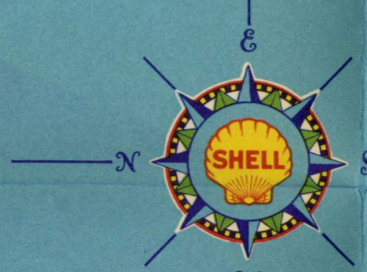

A CENTURY OF PROGRESS EXPOSITION

CHICAGO'S 1934 Century of Progress Exposition offers a wealth of fresh and diverting attractions—beautiful new buildings, pictureque foreign villages and thrilling novelties.

ITALIAN VILLAGE—The realm of the Old World is found in the foreign village—new this year—giving visitors the thrill of a tour through strange lands. Sunny Italy is vividly depicted in the colorful walled village, with its leaning towers, Gothic palaces and a reproduction of the home of Columbus, native shops and restaurants and shops for native visitors.

SWISS VILLAGE—The majestic scenery of the Alps dominates the picturesque capital. Synthetic snow, ice, chalets, a troupe of yodelers and native craftsmen lead an air of naturalness to this charming village. Swiss restaurants and shops.

GERMAN VILLAGE—"Schwarzwalder Dorf"—the wild beauty of the Black Forest in winter. A delightful place to linger on a hot day. Snow and huge icicles; ice skating; air conditioned buildings. An actual German village with all its business and social activities, restaurants and music.

IRISH VILLAGE—Nestled in cool moss and ferns, this village is captivating with its reproduction of Tara's Hall, an old lighthouse, native thatched cottages, jaunting cars and a piece of the Blarney Stone. Visitors are entertained with Irish jigs and reels.

ENGLISH VILLAGE—Here in the land of Shakespeare visitors delight in exploring the familiar historic buildings. Ann Hathaway's cottage at Stratford-upon-Avon; Squire Manser's ancestral home of Walsingham; Robert Barne's home, and Dickens' "Old Curiosity Shop." English beef and ale served at the Inn.

TUNISIA—The land of the Bedouins. Arab merchants, in colorful garb, and native artists demonstrate the handicrafts of the country. Street bazaars; snake charmers; free performances at the Arab Theatre.

THE OASIS—A spot of fertile beauty on the edge of the desert, where visitors may rest and enjoy the quiet beauty of the village. Foreign Legion drills, mythical, and oriental dancers intrigue visitors.

DUTCH VILLAGE—A popular reminder of the Netherlands, with its windmill, canals and dykes. Natives in bright costumes and wooden shoes market the delectable Edam cheese made in the village.

STREETS OF SHANGHAI—That famous Chinese port is artistically portrayed in this alluring village. Shops from the Far East are found along the narrow winding streets, lighted by myriad lanterns. Chinese restaurants and theatre.

COLONIAL VILLAGE—Reminiscent of the early history of our country.

Around the village green are scores of quaint buildings, including replicas of the Betty Ross house, the Old North Church, House of Seven Gables and Franklin's printing shop.

WATER DISPLAY—A huge brilliantly lighted fountain two blocks long in the lagoon is one of the highlights of the Fair. The sound of the falling water may be heard for a half-mile.

WORLD IN MINIATURE—A fascinating exhibit of 24 tiny rooms with delicately carved pieces of furniture and ornament, perfect in scale and workmanship. Rooms of American design ranging from a kitchen in Old Salem to ultra-modern rooms of 1934 are featured.

THE MIDWAY—With its shows and bazaars, has been relocated on Northern Island—the amusement zone for 1934. Conveniently grouped, amusements, thrilling rides and gay cafes make this new carnival area a mecca for pleasure seekers.

SKY RIDE—Visitors enjoying the panoramic view of Chicago from the towers of the Sky Ride are thrilled with the new talking telescope working in connection with the ray of light pointing to various buildings around the city. Select the building you wish to see and listen to the half-minute discourse about it.

ENCHANTED ISLAND—with more than 40 new features has been acclaimed the greatest entertainment project ever created for children. The Fireman's Fountain, with an electrical display simulating fire; the Hedge-Maze with a free merry-ground ride; and the story book characters in Adventure Land are only a few of the new and amusing attractions that delight Young America.
