The following Regulation has been received from the Department of War, and is published for the guidance of all concerned:


“Paragraph 1103, GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR THE ARMY, will be so construed as to embrace soldiers temporarily placed in private hospitals, by competent authority.

Upon the recommendation of the senior Surgeon of any post or detachment, approved by the Commanding Officer, diseased soldiers may be placed temporarily in private hospitals, provided that the charges of each shall not exceed the commutation for rations allowed by paragraph 1103, General Regulations.
