

Dear Sir

Bladenburgh 15th April 1700

I enclose you will receive a Warrant from the Naval office in this district for 10 Bales of the goods imported by me in the *Susanna* which have been re-ported to Virginia, together with certificate of their being landed and entered there.

There being nothing in the law obliging the entry of goods for exportation at the office where they were entered, General Williams and Capt. Singan both give credit for any goods that have been entered at their offices, on such Vouchers being lodged with them as are enclosed; and I make no doubt but Major Jones will do the same. I must therefore request you will be so good as to send these papers to him; and desire him to give credit on the Bond given for duties on goods imported by me in the *Susanna*, for the drawback allowed by the law on the 10 Bales exported.
