A Letter from Mr Constable who had the Good
 :ness to take Charge of Monies to pay Taxes on Mr Chesser's
 Trust and on my Part of 2^d 1/2 for the Year 1803 informs
 me that there remains due a Sum of \$395.36 on their
 Tracts for the Year 1800 and on Mr Chesser's Trust the
 Taxes for 1801 and 1802 together \$384.92 besides the
 Interest and Charges - He states moreover that the In:
 :terest is running at the Rate of 14 1/2% And that Mr
 Cochran from the Receipts of whose Note these Payments
 were to have been made has not furnished any Part of
 the expected Funds. As it is important that these Demands
