moved to Jamaica
to relieve those of
the 84th which are
to be brought Home -
having been abroad
since December 1826.

It is further most
humbly submitted to
Your Majesty, that the
Service Companies of the
98th Regiment be sent
from Gibraltar to Jamaica

Majesty, but not to be
replaced from Home -
by which the Garrison
of Gibraltar will be
reduced to the numbers
which were stationed
there previously to
September 1830. viz:-
the Service Companies
of 5 Regiments. -
