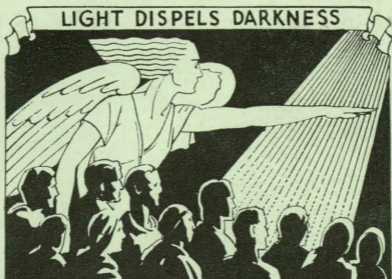

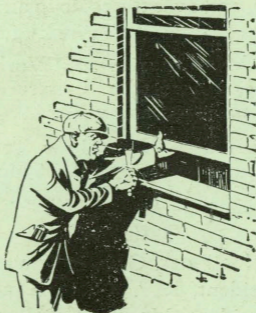

INTERDENOMINATIONAL « EVANGELICAL

Board of Directors — Prominent ministers and laymen representing 9 protestant denominations.

Workers — Converted and trained foreigners, speaking 26 languages, and laboring among the people of their own nationalities.

Equipment — Mission Halls, Training Classes, Bibles, Christian literature and periodicals in 38 different languages.

Immediate Field — Thirteen northern states in this country. Especially the large cities, the mining districts and rural communities where foreigners abound.

Method — Visitation and personal work in homes, coffee houses and on the streets. Personal testimony and preaching by voice, the printed page, and over the radio in all languages.

Expense — An amount of about \$25,000 supports 20 Missionaries and Workers, who distribute \$2,000 worth of literature, conduct 2,000 public meetings and visit 34,000 homes.
