**TRIO OF WOMEN TRAFFICKERS FINED; ONE IS SENT TO PRISON.**

Chicago Judges Met Out Severe Punishment to Men Found Guilty of Exploiting Girls in Levee Districts.

Three persons involved in trafficking in women were fined or imprisoned by Chicago judges yesterday.

The most seasoned offender against the Illinois laws bearing upon the traffic, John Koszkowski, alias John Reed, was sentenced by Judge Hopkins at the West Chicago avenue court to the maximum imprisonment of one year and the maximum fine of \$300.

**CONVICTED OF PANDERING**-The Committee of Fifteen, recently incorporated as an organization to suppress the white slave traffic, scored its first conviction yesterday morning when John Koszkowski, alias John Reed, head usher of the Crown Theater, was found guilty of pandering in the West Chicago avenue court. He was fined \$300 and one year in the house of correction. Koszkowski met Ella Klarkowski July 5, 1910, and almost immediately afterward placed her in a resort at 2115 Dearborn street. Four months later he was arrested and later married the girl, but again placed her in house of prostitution.

System of Pandering Exposed  
During Hearing of Stella  
O'Connor Case.

Adam Lewicki, proprietor of a resort at  
1040 The Strand, in South Chicago, was found  
guilty of violating the Mann act by a jury  
in Municipal Judge Turnbough's court yes-  
terday. He will receive his sentence tomor-  
row or Tuesday. The punishment is from  
one to five years' imprisonment and a fine of  
\$1,000.

The case grew out of an attempt on the part  
of Lewicki to place Stella O'Connor, 20 years  
old, a waitress, in his resort after meeting  
her in a chop suey restaurant in Monroe  
street Sunday evening, May 28. By way of  
gaining her friendship he paid for her dinner.

Causes Arrest of Girl.

When she refused to accompany the resort  
keeper in a taxi cab Lewicki had her ar-  
rested for the alleged theft of \$15, following  
her to her room at 802 Sedgwick street with  
an officer.

Miss O'Connor appealed to Municipal Judge  
Stewart when the case was called in the  
Deplaines street court the following morn-  
ing and on her evidence Lewicki was held  
until a warrant could be sworn out, while  
the charge against her was dismissed.

Lewicki will be tried on two other charges  
of trafficking in women, on complaint of  
Anna Turren, 19 years old, who claims that  
she was lured to the Lewicki resort on July  
1 by Helen Blewsky, under promise of mak-  
ing "easy money"—but not in the manner  
it proved to be.

Two charges have also been made against  
the Blewsky woman in the Turren case.  
The Turren girl, like Miss O'Connor, was em-  
ployed in a restaurant. She lived at 1443  
Toll street with a relative.

Hunted Prey in Restaurants.

Lewicki's "system," as followed in the  
O'Connor case, was to pick up an ac-  
quaintance with girls he met in restaurants.  
According to the testimony of Officer Van  
Dusen, who arrested Miss O'Connor, the of-  
ficer refused to make the arrest when he  
learned that only \$1 was involved instead of  
\$15, and Lewicki then threatened to "send  
him traveling a beat in the salt grass."

"I have a pull with Chief McWaters," the  
resortkeeper was reported to have said.

With the Turren girl a different system  
was followed, the Blewsky woman renting a  
room in the same house with the girl and  
gaining her confidence by taking her to mov-  
ing picture shows and other entertainments.
