## EXTRACTS FROM SPEECH CHICAGO HONORS

MARTIN B. MADDEN

Mr. Speaker, I am opposed to the intermarriage of the races. The Negroes themselves are pposed to such marriages. But I am also opposed to legislation making such marriages a crime. If a white man and a bluck woman want to marry it should be a matter for them to decide. ! think they would both be foolish to thus ostricise themselves from assocition with their own people and that is what they do when they marry Fut if they want to ostracise themselves, that is a personal matter between them and it shouid be.

To make such marriages criminal and void would leave the children of such marriages without the protection which they eed and should have. Instead of bettering moral conditions such'a law would make them werse. It would leave mary young girls at the mercy of Urutes willing to take advanof their virtue and then desert them to a life of shame. I cannot conceive of a condition un der a hich white men should be allowed to cohabit with a black woman not his wife with out being compelled by law to marry her or to provide for the care of her children, Why should innocent women of the Negio race not have the same protection of the law which is ac orded to women of ny other race? It will not do to say there is no such coadition as that to which I have alluded everyone knows better elise how does it happen that we have so many people of mixed hlood in the Uni.ed States,

The Negroes are willing to confine their ma riages fo their race, indeed the would prefer that, but they nave a right to demand that th: women of their race shall not be considered the legitimate pre of men of other races. (Applause)
