PUBLIC HOUSING stands as a partial answer to the cry of many of our worthy citizens with incomes so low that they cannot pay for decent housing in privately owned properties. To hold fast to that which is good in our fellowmen, decent housing is being provided to make it possible for those who find themselves temporarily in distress to bring themselves out of the slums and squalor.



THE IDA B. WELLS HOMES is the fourth low-rent housing project under the management and operation of the Chicago Housing Authority. These homes are located on a little less than forty-seven acres of ground on Chicago's Southside, between Thirty-seventh and Thirty-ninth Streets and Cottage Grove Avenue and South Parkway. The area was purchased and cleared by the Housing Division of the Public Works Administration and sold by the United States Housing Authority to the Chicago Housing Authority. At a cost of nearly \$9,000,000 the 125 buildings, with 1662 separate dwelling units, will provide well ventilated and well lighted, standard living accommodations for approximately 7,000 persons in low-income families.

THE UNITED STATES HOUSING AUTHORITY has agreed to make annual grants to the Chicago Housing Authority in order that the dwellings in the IDA B. WELLS HOMES may be in reach of the lowest-income, poorest-housed families in our community. With this assistance, the monthly rentals for the apartments in the IDA B. WELLS HOMES have been fixed as follows:

These monthly rentals include heat, hot and cold water, gas, electric light and electric refrigeration.

OUR EARNEST HOPE is that in the IDA B. WELLS HOMES there will be an opportunity for a wholesome kind of living for thousands of children and young people, preserving them as valuable assets to themselves and to our community and nation. Here strong bodies and healthy minds may develop; here parents may live and work together for the realization of the dream and ideal of every mother and father and of that noble, courageous woman in whose memory these homes have been named.
