Roan Horse called Dove.

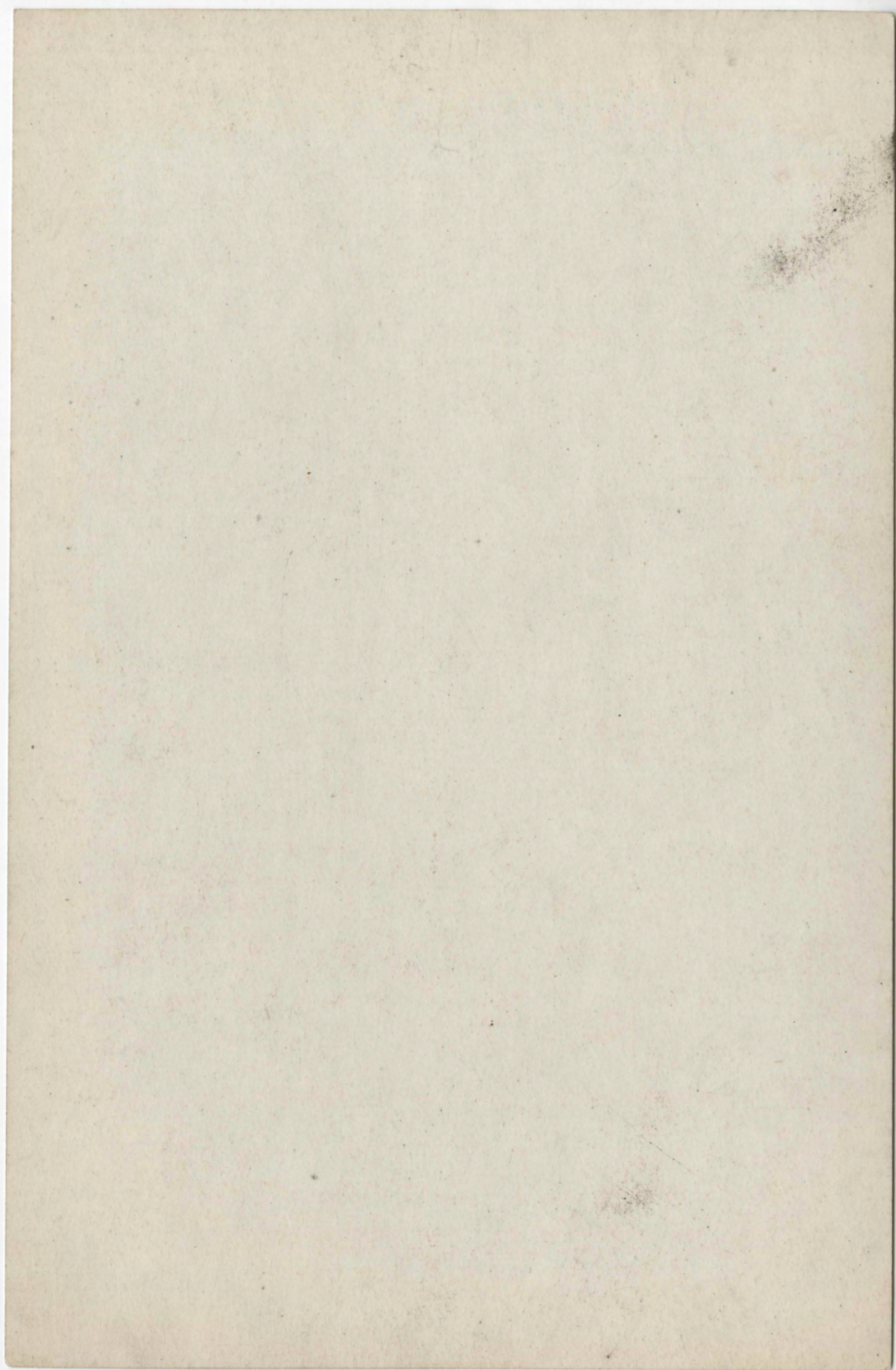
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Joseph one
