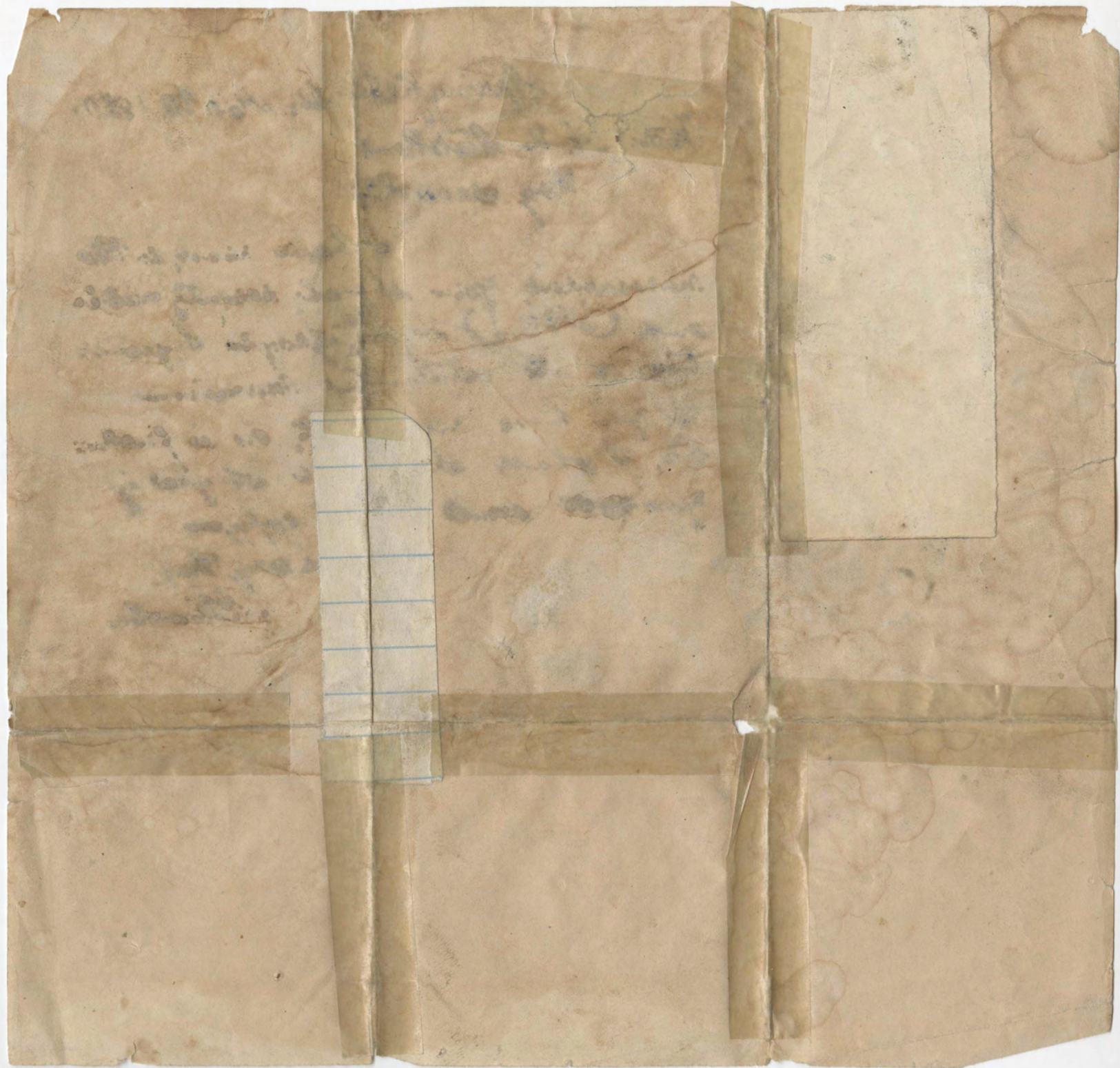


Springfield, Mo. Nov 30. 1860.
