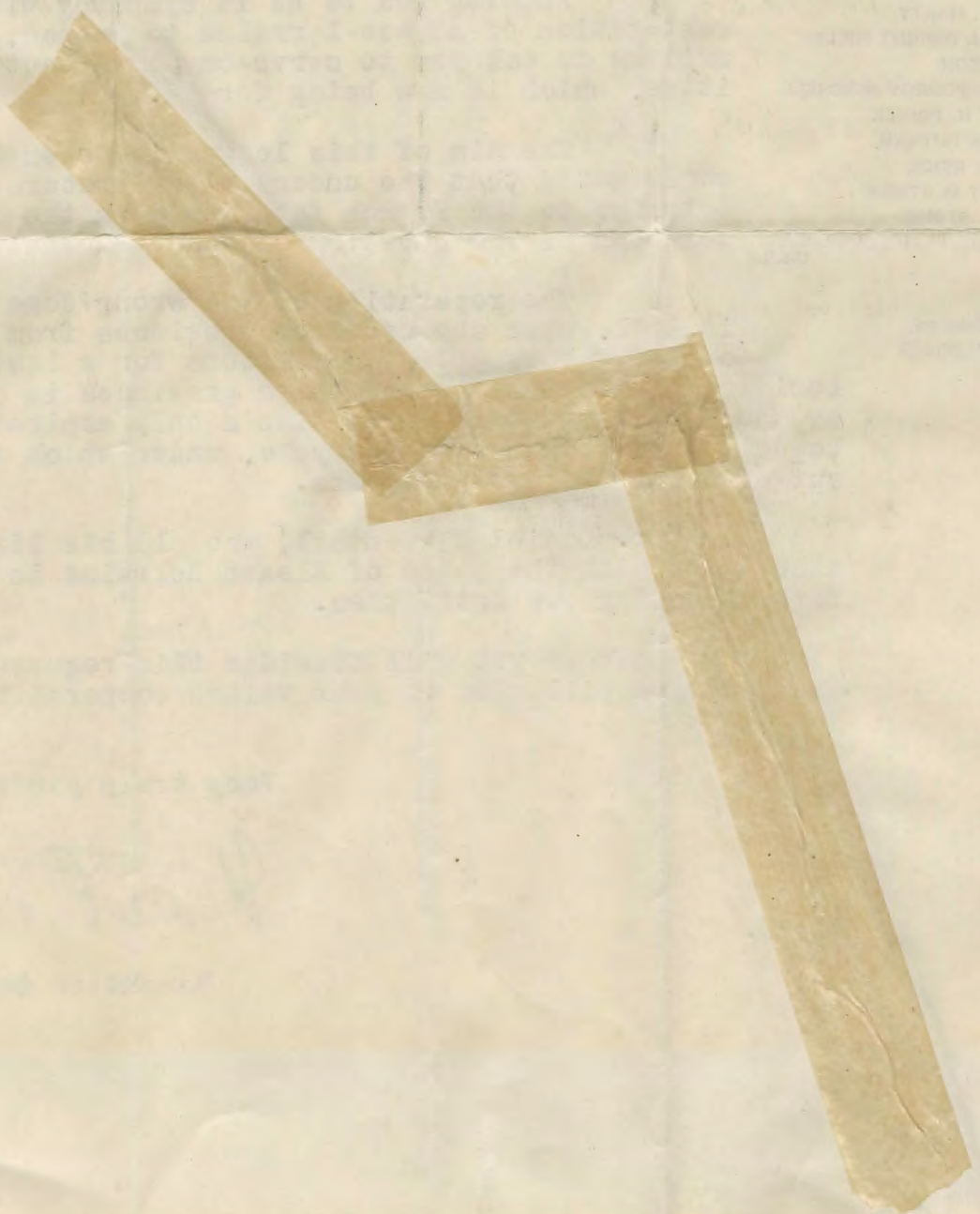

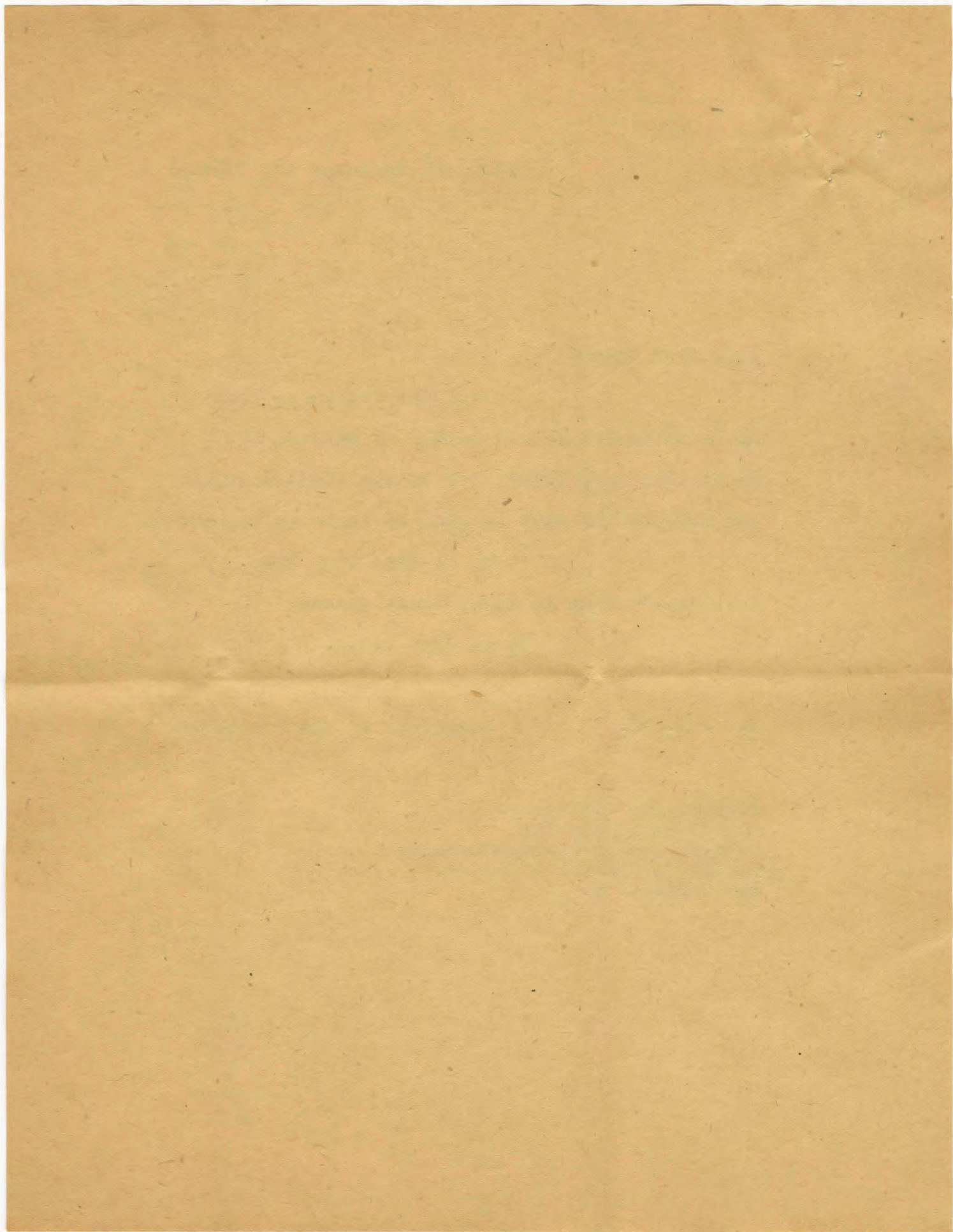

I have made inquiry of persons in high standing here regarding the World League for the Restoration of Alsace-Lorraine. Mr. Blumenthal was mayor of Colmar. When the war broke out he escaped to France and is a duly authorized representative of the French government in this country. He has formed this League for the purpose of organizing and carrying on educational work in this country on the subject of Alsace-Lorraine. It is intended that the committee, when formed, shall come together for the purpose of devising an educational program. The plan has been submitted to the proper authorities at Washington and has, so I have been told, their informal approval.

We are awaiting with bated breath the outcome of tomorrow's municipal election here. The anti-Tammany vote is so split that it looks as though the Tammany candidate would win. As he is also the candidate of Hearst and the German Democratic Party and has himself flirted with all those opposed to Mitchel's attitude on the war his election will be little short of a calamity. As for the improved municipal organization which Mitchel has brought about, that, of course, will go smash immediately after Mitchel's defeat. While we are engaged in the effort to make the
