for a Negro woman Charity about Twenty
five years of age sold as the property
of Jacob Collins deceased under an Order
of the Honorable Superior Court of Baldwin
County when sitting for Ordinary purposes
granted on the Twelfth day of January
Eighteen hundred and forty seven which
said Negro woman was sold at public
out cry on Tuesday the second day of
February 1847 and knocked off to the said
Thomas Humphries as the highest bidder.

I David Collins administrator of all
and singular the goods and chattels lands
and tenements, rights and credits which
were of the said Jacob Collins deceased.
do by these presents warrant and defend
the right and title to the said Negro woman
Charity unto the said Thomas Humphries
his heirs and assigns forever against the
claim of myself as administrator or assign and
and against the claim of all others.

This second day of February 1847.
