Warfield and S. Moore Subscribing witnesses there and

Know all men by these presents, that We John
Allen, and Betty Allen for divers Causes and
Considerations unto this moving, do hereby eman-
cipate & set at Liberty our negroes George, Sam-
on, Herta, Hannah, Jack, and their increase
~~at the~~ reserving their service to us for and
during the life of the undersigned Betty
Allen - As we clearly wish it to be
understood, that at the death of the
S^r Betty Allen, said negroes & their in-
crease are to be free & not before - &
we hereby acknowledge the above &
desire it shall be recorded as irrevoca-
ble - given under our hands & seals
this the 3^d of Sept 1823 - We do
hereby at the expiration of three years
from this day set at Liberty Negro Man
Schieb whom we have sold to B. Warfield
for S^r Thomas, provided he serves said Allen
said said term faithfully. The day
above all of which is irrevocable &
to be placed upon record in Harmon
County -
