Abstract	Formally established in 1960, the Committee for the Comparative Study of New Nations was a group of University of Chicago faculty from several social sciences departments, all of whom had an interest in the problems of developing countries. This collection contains meeting minutes, correspondence, reports, publications, research papers, and other material documenting the committee from its founding through the mid-1970s.

Historical Note

Formally established in 1960, the Committee for the Comparative Study of New Nations was a group of faculty from several social sciences departments, all of whom had an interest in the problems of developing countries. In their own departments, many of these faculty members specialized in the study of Asian and African societies. In the committee, these faculty members explored inter-disciplinary approaches to problems shared by new nations. The committee's activities were supported largely through grants from major foundations.

Founding faculty members included Edward Shils, Clifford Geertz, McKim Marriott, Lloyd A. Fallers, Morris Janowitz, Manning Nash, and Max Rheinstein. While the membership was originally intended to be kept relatively small, the committee more than doubled in size over the next ten years, and included many of the university's leading faculty in anthropology, history, law, and education. The scope of the committee's interest also expanded to include studies of developing nations worldwide, issues of imperialism and colonialism, and broader research in the comparative development of societies. The committee dissolved in the mid-1970s, following the departure of key faculty members.

The committee did not award degrees, but supported graduate and post-doctoral study through a fellowship program. Fellows worked closely with committee members while conducting advanced study in comparative analysis of developing nations.

The committee's intellectual activities centered on weekly seminars, in which faculty and fellows of the committee discussed and presented research on broad topics. The committee also organized interdisciplinary conferences, and hosted public lectures by visiting scholars and dignitaries.

Scope Note

Series I: Correspondence, contains incoming and outgoing letters and memoranda of the committee chair and administrative support staff. Along with routing administrative correspondence regarding personnel and coursework, this series includes memos and internal correspondence related to the founding and development of the committee, along with related reports and proposals. Series II: Meetings, contains minutes and agendas, as well as related correspondence, reports and notes. Topics discussed at meetings of the committee and the smaller Executive Committee included fellowships, committee members' research, publications, faculty appointments, and special events.

Series III: Grants, documents the funding of the committee through support from organizations such as the Carnegie Corporation, Ford Foundation and Rockefeller Foundation. Materials in this series include grant proposals, applications, reports, and related correspondence.

Series IV: Publications, is divided into two subseries. Subseries 1: Editorial Files, includes drafts, proofs, correspondence and other material related to two collections of essays published by the committee: Old Societies and New States, the Quest for Modernity in Asia and Africa, edited by Clifford Geertz and published in 1963; and Economic Nationalism in Old and New States, edited by Harry Johnson and published in 1968. Subseries 2: Administrative Files and Publicity Material, includes correspondence related to the development of brochures and pamphlets, sample publications, publications of other university departments. Also included is correspondence related to requests for reprints and other committee publications.

Series V: Conferences, contains material related to two conferences organized by the committee: The Conference on Research for Development in West Africa, held in Ibadan, Nigeria in 1961; and the Conference on Lebanese Democracy, held in 1963. Organized according to conference, the materials in this series include programs, schedules, drafts of papers presented, and correspondence discussing organizational and administrative matters.

Series VI: Visitors, documents the many scholars and dignitaries hosted by the committee. This series contains correspondence, programs, broadsides, biographical material, schedules, and drafts of lectures and speeches. Most of this material is arranged alphabetically by visitor.

Series VII: Facilities, contains university administrative correspondence, reports and surveys. Subject matter includes the management of Pick Hall and other Social Sciences Division buildings; as well as university equipment and services.

Series VIII: Seminars, documents the weekly events that were the committee's central activity. Subseries 1: Chronological File, contains correspondence, drafts of papers, schedules, lecture notes, and other material related to the organization and conduction of seminars. Subseries 2: Student Papers, contains graded student work from 1966. Series IX: Financial, is organized chronologically, and contains annual budgets and financial reports, as well as routine financial matters such as invoices, check requests, vouchers and statements.

Series X: Personnel, contains material related to faculty and non-academic staff associated with the committee. This series is divided into three subseries. Subseries 1: Staff and Faculty Files, includes letters of appointment, applications and termination forms related to the service of individual personnel. Subseries 2: Biographical Files, contains bibliographies, faculty reports, c.v.'s, drafts of research, administrative correspondence, and other material documenting the activities of many of the committee's faculty members. Subseries 3: Administrative Memoranda, discusses mainly routine university and divisional procedures and policies for salaries, appointments and benefits, as well as Affirmative Action programs and employment initiatives.

Series XI: Fellowships, is divided into two subseries. Subseries 1: Administration, contains mainly correspondence from prospective fellowship applicants, as well as internal memoranda and solicitations for applications. Subseries 2: Applications and Awards, contains application forms and personal statements, notifications of awards granted and denied, correspondence deliberating decisions, recommendations and transcripts.

Series XII: Course Administration, contains grade reports, syllabi and outlines from Social Sciences Division courses, including those given by the committee.
