Abstract	David Chandler (fl. 1838-1857) was a shopkeeper in Newburgh, New York in the mid-1800s. This collection contains a number of account books and journals kept between 1838 and 1857.

Biographical Note

David Chandler was a shopkeeper in Newburgh, New York in the mid-1800s. Contains account books recording purchases including appliances, weaponry, “sundries,” and foodstuffs. Little is known about Chandler beyond what is contained in this collection.

Scope Note

The David Chandler collection includes six notebooks. Four are account books in which Chandler kept record of the transactions in his store. These books are arranged chronologically. Two are journals kept by Chandler in the 1840s. Entries concern his life at the store, debts incurred and paid, and the weather. These books are also arranged chronologically.

The collection was previously part of the Miscellaneous Manuscripts Collection.
